

A Brief History of the Cunningham Family in and Around the Railway Towns | Gerard Cunningham

Thomas Cunningham emigrated from County Clare, Ireland in 1856, and had 12 children with Margaret Burke. The two eldest sons, Matt and Ned took up tenant farms on land owned by the Chirnside family at Werribee South.

The area of the Koo Wee Rup swamp as yet uncleared was opened up for selection and purchase of blocks in 1901, ranging from 60 to 120 acres. Paddy Cunningham, younger brother of Matt and Ned took up one of these blocks in 1903 on the corner of the 11 Mile and 9 Mile drains. Paddy's older brother Tom who had been gold mining in WA, took up another 120 acres next to Paddy on the Nine Mile Road. The brothers worked together on clearing their blocks.

About 1907, Paddy and Tom took up another block on Daly Road, just off the 9 Mile Road, in the name of their father Thomas. Tom (Senior's) wife Margaret had come to Daly Road with their 3 younger daughters, Julia, Kit (Catherine) and Ellen (Nell) and their youngest so James (Jim). An elder daughter Margaret who was a widow with one daughter had come to NNG with her parents at the same time. One of the Bunyip South (Iona) settlers, Michael Scanlon, had left his block at Iona and was now running a Butcher shop from Tynong. He teamed up with Margaret McCarthy (Cunningham) in 1912 and they went onto have 6 children.

When my brother Barry and I compiled the list of descendants of Mathew and Margaret in 2002, the Scanlon line had the greatest number of descendants. About 1915, Tom junior who now had 10 children swapped his block on the 9 Mile Road for a block next door to his parents on Daly Road. His original block on the 9 Mile was taken over by Michael and Margaret Scanlon.

Meanwhile eldest son Mathew who had been tenant farming for the Chirnsides' at Werribee decided to join the family in the NNG district in 1913 by purchasing a property of 120 acres on the 8 Mile Road. They came with 10 children – Mary, Julia, Joseph, Agnes, Thomas, Mathew, John, Vince, Daniel and Bridget. They called the property "lona Vale". The property had been pioneered by the Stribling family who had the store in NNG. The original homestead still remains having been beautifully restored by its present owner Trevor Parker.

A further 3 blocks were added to the original purchase by Mathew and Margaret. "Fergusons" on the southern corner of the Convent School Road, "Denman's" on the northern corner of the 8 Mile Road and Convent Road and the "Costellos" on the eastern side of the 8 Mile Road.

With so many children belonging to the Cunningham and related families around the 8 and 9 Mile Roads, a Convent Catholic School was required. Under the leadership of Matt Cunningham and Michael Scanlon, a Catholic school – St Josephs, Cora Lynn was opened in 1918 in Convent School Road. The building still stands and is now owned and occupied by Ambrose Byrne, the son of the famous Goon residents Bernie and Phyllis Byrne of "Creekside", Nar Nar Goon South.

From this point, I shall concentrate on the family of Matt and Margaret. "Iona Vale" on the 8 Mile Road and their children and grand children. Of the 10 children, only 3 of the boys married. Two of the daughters of Matt and

Margaret – Julie and Bridget- became Nuns with the Sisters of St Joseph. They spent the next 50 plus years teaching in Catholic schools all over Victoria.

Joe married Rita Finnigan from Cora Lynn. They had 2 children, Matt and Veronica. Joe died very young in 1941. Tom "Pompey" Cunningham married Winnie O'Donoghue from Dunnstown near Ballarat. They had 6 children – Maureen, Barry, John (Jack), Gerard, Patricia and Gregory. Dan Cunningham married Bridie McGrath from Nar Nar Goon. They had nine children: Phonse, Bryan, Peter, Maree, Dan, John, Carmel, Pauline and Bernard. Dan was the businessman of the family. In the 1940s, he and Bridie set up a carrying business based in NNG. Milk cartage in cans to the Bayles factory was the mainstay of the business plus the cartage of potatoes and other farm supplies around the Nar Nar Goon district.

For the male members of the family, football was the sport of choice. All 6 sons of Matt and Margaret played for the Nar Nar Goon and the Nar Nar Goon/Iona successful teams during the 1920s and 30s. Joe and Dan were both captains of a couple of those teams. Pompey was one of the star players. He continued to play with Nar Nar Goon until he was 44 years old!!! He played a couple of games for Richmond in the early 30s and a couple of games for St Kilda a few years later. Dan played a couple of games for Melbourne. One would have to ask why they didn't go on? Perhaps they weren't good enough!!!

The next generation produced a couple of VFL players. Of Matt and Margaret's 10 children, their son Joe was the father of Matt the third, who was a star player for Nar Nar Goon in the early 1950s. In 1954 he won the Clancy medal for the Best and Fairest in the Gippsland League. He was recruited by Fitzroy in the VFL in 1956 and played 3 seasons there before returning to play with Cora Lynn. Pompey's eldest Barry, was on the list at Collingwood as a 16 year old but returned to play for the Goon. As a 21 year old he was appointed playing/coach of Nar Nar Goon and led them to be runners up, losing the Grand Final to Pakenham.

Phonse Cunningham (Dan's eldest) played in the 1965 Nar Nar Goon premiership coached by Billy Drake from Pakenham.

Tom (Pompey's) second son John (Jack) was part of Hawthorn's 1961 first VFL Premiership team.


Barry also coached at Lang Lang and Cora Lynn before returning to the Goon to play for them in the 1970 Premiership team. Four Cunninghams – Barry, John, Dan and Gerard played in the 1970 premiership team at Nar Nar Goon.


On the girls side, netball featured strongly. Pompey's second daughter Patricia (Patsy) had a long and successful career playing NNG. Dan's wife Bridie one of the original organisers of the West Gippsland Basketball (Netball) Association in the early 1950s.

Political involvement at both a Local and a Federal level was a feature of the family over the years. Matt from "lona Vale" was a Councilor for the Berwick Shire from 1918 to 1932. His son Dan, took up that role at the Berwick Shire 1960 to 1980. Pompey's eldest son Barry was elected to the Federal seat of McMillan (now Monash) in 1980. It was most unusual for a famer to be elected for the Labor Party. Barry had inherited his support for Labor from his father who stuck with Labor when most of his religious connections and relations had gone over to the DLP and eventually finished up with the Liberals. He also had loyalty to Ned Hogan, a cousin on his mother's side who was Labor Premier of victoria in the 1930s.

Barry was a great supporter and friend of Bob Hawke and ended up Chief Government Whip in the Hawke Government. Barry held the seat for 13 years until he was defeated in 2013.

Reader Request: Tips for Dealing with Barking Dogs (cardinia.vic.gov.au)

If you hear a barking dog...

1. Let the owner know about the problem. Speak to the owner first to make them aware of the problem and let them know how it is affecting you. Sometimes owners may not be aware their dog is barking too much if it happens when they are not home. Letting them know about the problem gives them the opportunity to fix it.



If you are not comfortable speaking with the owner directly, we suggest you print off and fill in the details on this Letter to owner of barking dog (available via cardinia.vic.gov.au) and drop it in their letterbox.

- 2. If the barking is still an issue, report it to the council via website or phone. If speaking to the owner does not fix the issue, report the problem using the Report a barking dog online form or by calling 1300 787 624.
- 3. Council will ask you to fill out a noise diary. You will then be asked to complete a noise diary to help council understand the problem. Once you return the noise diary, we will review it, investigate the problem and take action if required. Council will let the dog's owner know, in writing, that a complaint has been made. We will not let them know who has made the complaint. If the noise stops after you have reported it, please let council know in writing at mail@cardinia.vic.gov.au

If you own a barking dog...


If you have animals on your property, you must take all reasonable steps to prevent them from making unreasonable noise, in accordance with Community Local Law 2024 (section 48)

It is normal and healthy for animals to make noise, for example, for a dog to bark. However, it is not reasonable for it to bark continuously, to bark too much, or to bark through the night. Dogs bark for a variety of reasons. When dogs bark excessively, this usually suggests there is an underlying problem. The first step is to work out why your dog is barking too much. Once you find out what is causing the barking, you can make some positive changes that will hopefully fix the issue.

Tips for reducing barking

Take your dog on more walks | Head to an off-leash area: Run your dog regularly in one of Cardinia Shire's designated off-leash parks. | Provide toys and entertainment: Make your backyard more interesting by leaving toys and a large raw marrow bone for your dog to chew. | Check food, water and shelter: Make sure your dog has fresh water, a balanced diet, and adequate shelter from bad weather. If possible, give it access to the house through a dog door. | Take your dog to obedience classes/dog training: Training can teach your dog what is OK to bark at, and what isn't. | Block the view: If the dog is barking at passers-by, block its view of movement outside the property with solid fencing, shade cloth or hedging. | Visit the vet: Make sure your dog is in good health by taking it to the vet for a check-up. Your vet can also give you behaviour advice that can help.



Garfield North Community Centre starts to take shape

Construction is progressing on the much-needed Garfield North Community centre, a multifunctional space for local residents and organisations to hold community gatherings and events.

Since commencing works in May, More Building Group has been on site completing earthworks and preparing the land for construction. The slab pouring was completed in early June, roofing and framing works are complete and external cladding, window and door installations are currently underway.

Modules have arrived on site to support the new community centre's modular build, including a social room, kitchen, meeting room, storage, amenities, and a spectator cover/veranda.

Cardinia Shire Council Mayor, Cr Jack Kowarzik says the new building is set to become a central gathering point for the community.

'Located within Cannibal Creek Reserve, the new facility will be a hub perfect for community and social events, supporting various user groups in the area'.


'We're grateful for the community's patience and support throughout the construction process and look forward to seeing this project come to life' he says.

The project is supported by a \$1.3 million Victorian Government Growing Suburbs Fund grant, advocated for by user groups and the Cannibal Creek Reserve Committee, as well as a \$1 million investment from Cardinia Shire Council.

Over the coming months, contractors will be finalising the window installation, the solar PV system, and completing the mechanical, electrical and plumbing services rough in. Works are anticipated for completion late September/early October, pending weather conditions.






